The Women in Aerospace awards celebrate women's professional excellence in aerospace, annually recognizing female leaders who have made outstanding contributions to the aerospace community. The 2014 recipients are as follows:

**AEROSPACE AWARENESS AWARD: Dr. Lynn Cominsky**, Sonoma St. University, Rohnert Park, California, for her excellent leadership and sustained dedication to aerospace education and for her tenacious advocacy for girls and young women in aerospace.

**OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT AWARD: Allison Barto**, Program Manager, Ball Aerospace & Technologies Corporation, Boulder, Colorado, for her achievements and contributions to NASA's James Webb Space Telescope Program.

**AEROSPACE EDUCATOR AWARD: Alexandra Kindrat**, Teacher, Lester B. Pearson School Board, St. Thomas High School, Montreal, Quebec, Canada, for her international and local leadership, innovation, and instructional practices, and her unwavering commitment to the advancement of women of all ages in the aerospace field.
